CANAL AND RAIL.

Rallway Age: Writing to the Yale Review, Professor A. T. Hadley says: "Many an advocale of canal projects claims that a canal is a cheaper means of transportation than a railroad. If we compare the expense of railway transportation, including interest and maintenance, with the expense of canal transportation, not including interest and maintenance, this is sometimes so. The reason that the comparison is made in this fashion is because the government habitually pays interest and maintenance on the canal, so that this is supposed to be no part of the expense to the shipper. But it represents a cost to the public just as much as if it were paid by private individuals, and any legislation which ignores this element of cost is blindly increasing public

burdens." This is a point which the Railway Age has insisted on more than once, and following the argument a step further we come to this dilemma: Counting the cost of construction (or interest) and maintenance, which in the case of waterways are paid by the government out of money raised from taxation, the people of the United States pay more for each ton of goods shipped by water than they do for each ton shipped by rail. To the people as a whole water transportation is the more expensive. Either the individual shipper pays the greater cost he does not. If the whole people is equally interested in water transportation, then he does. In which case he is a fool to use it, and the canals are a burden to him. If the whole people is not equally interested, then the multitude are being taxed for the benefit of the few; which is grossly wrongful and In This
