AN OREGON JUBILEE

Just fifty years ago last Sunday (June | WALLED FL C 28, 1846) a young man was ordained deacon in Philadelphia. That young man is now the Bishop of Oregon, the Rt. Rev. H. Wistar Morris D. D.

At the jubilee service in Trinity church, Portland, Sunday, June 28, 1896 to commemorate the event (an event, fi we mistake not, never before commemgrated on the Pacific Coast) there were in the chancel with the bishop of Ore gon, the Rt. Rev. Ethelbert Talbot, D. D., bishop of Wyoming and Idaho; the Rt. Rev. Lemuel H. Weils, D. D., bishop of Spokane, and the Rt. Rev. Wm. Morris Barker, D. D., the bishop of Olympia.

In the twenty-eight years that have passed since flishop Morris was sent by the board of mission of the Protest ant Episcopal Church to take the jurisdiction of Oregon, Washington and Idaho for Christ and His church, he has seen it grow and develop into four jurisdictions. There are doubtless children now living who will see all of these four subdivided into four, or more, each. The march of events here in our midst is rapid indeed.

Compare this growth which seems a slow to some of our restless business men, with the growth in other sections and it will be seen that we are ahead of and not behind many of them.

What elsewhere has taken 150 or 200 or even more years to develop has been done here in 50 years. In 1846 we are told that two cabins about a mile apart all there was of Portland. 
