I is valued at \$200,000. There are 65 case of electric machinery, 23 cases of incar descent electric globes, 395 cases of cor ensed milk, 15 cases of insulated wire 1,000 kegs of wire nails from the Ever ett nail factory, 516 pieces of fir lum ber from Washington mills, 100 cask of beer, 236 pieces of iron pipe, fivcases of oleomargarine and an immens quantity of general merchandise, mak ing a total cargo of about 5,500 tons There is but one cabin passenger, Mr liruhl, who goes to Japan. In the steerage are 15 Chinese, one of whon is being deported by the United States government. He was convicted at Buffalo, N. Y., of being unlawfully in the country. Return passports allowing the bearers, under the new treaty, to return within one year although they are laborers, are carried by three of the Chinese. The remainder are merchants. Special Deputy Collector Walter Bowen, of Port Townsend, was in the city yesterday, arranging the papers of these Chinese.-Tacoma Ledger.
