

MATTERS MARINE

Movements of Vessels at Home and Elsawhere

The steamer Empire arrived down from Portland yesterday morning.

The schoner Pinoeer arrived down yesterday, lumber laden for California, and put to sea at 11 o'clock.

The British ship Sutherlandshire arrived down from Portland yesterday afternoon and docked at the O. R and N. wharf, where she will load

The barkentine Northwest arrived in from California yesterday afternoon in ballast. It is understood that she will load lumber at the mouth of the Cowlitz river.

The steamer Mexico arrived from San Francisco yesterday afternoon in place of the State, and left up for Portland in the evening. She had 210 tons of freight for Astoria and a fairly good passenger list.

The Tam O'Shanter, Captain Patterson, unexpectedly arrived in the harbor yesterday afternoon. In the dense haze outside she missed the tugboat and came on into the river. The tug carried orders for her to proceed to Gray's Harbor, which she will do this

The Star of France, the fast British ship, arrived in San Francisco the other day with a record of 113 days from London. Her first voyage was made to San Francisco in 1883 in 110 days, and in 1895 she made the passage in 114 days. Evidently she is keeping up her record.
