MATTERS MARINE

Movements of Vessels at Home and Elsewhere.

The steamer Harrison leaves for Big-saw this morning.

The brigantine Salvador arrived down from Portland Sunday.

The steamer State arrived in Sunday morning and left up for Portland.

The steamer Elmore arrived in from coast points yesterday and expects to leave out today.

The Rutherfordshire will probably finish loading salmon today, and will soon be ready for sea.

The four-master Chelmsford, now discharging steel rails at Flavel, has per-petuated her name in the marine history of the Columbia by having it given to the first dock built in the new city.

Like everything else in connection with the new town, she is the finest of her class; in fact, it is said to be one of the finest sailing vessels that ever entered the river. "Chelmsford Dock" is a good name.—Oregonian.

The British ship Fulwood, which arrived off the river Sunday, was towed into the harbor yesterday morning.

Captain Matthews was the pilot in charge. In conversation with an Astorian, Captain Lewis, of the Fulwood, said that he was 203 days from head to head, and about 207 days from dock to dock. One of his crew had a broken leg, the result of an accident off the Horn, and three of the men were sick with scurvy. While rounding Cape St. John, Staten Land, Captain Lewis spoke five full-rigged ships, one four-masted square-rigger and one double-topgallant bark. A month's bad weather was experienced off the Horn, and previous to that and after rounding the Horn, calm was experienced which accounts for the long voyage. The captain says the voyage was too good.

The main attraction on the water front nowadays is the steamer Eastern Oregon. She is tied up at Section 3 of the seawall, and men are busily engaged in taking out the engines and boilers. When this work is accomplished the vessel will be stripped and moved to the drydock, where she will be thoroughly overhauled and turned into a four-masted schooner. Captain Charles Nelson, who purchased the steamer, intends extending his connections. The Eastern Oregon was a twin screw steamer, and with the machinery he intends fitting out the coasting trade. These will be put in the coasting trade, and the Eastern Oregon will carry lumber from Puget Sound ports to Australia. The steamer was sold for \$5,000, but the expense of dismantling and rebuilding will cost considerable money. Nevertheless when Captain Nelson has his three vessels in running order he will be away ahead on the deal.—The Call.

Attention is again drawn to the importance of the Great Lake traffic by the opening of the new lock in the "Soo" canal at Sault Ste. Marie. This new lock has been about nine years in building, and costs the government about \$2,000,000. It has a length of 500 feet between gates, and a width of 100 feet, accommodating vessels that draw 21 feet of water. This outlet of Lake Superior passed last year 17,965 vessels, having a tonnage of 16,895,781, compared with 234 vessels, with a total tonnage of 4,443,246, that passed through the famous Suez canal. Commerce apparently justifies the outlay. And so does the saving in freights; for it is computed that, whereas in 1887 the average charge for the transportation of freight between the ports of Lake Superior and the lower lakes was 2.3 mills per ton mile, last year it was only .29 of a mill per ton mile. In 1889 it cost 15 cents to carry a ton of iron ore from the mines of Lake Superior to the ports of Lake Erie. Now it costs 10 cents per ton. Low freights have undoubtedly helped to stimulate the wonderful iron production of the upper lake region. Just as an open river at the delta and cascades of the Columbia will help the farmers of the inland Empire.—Oregonian.
