THE ASTORIA RAILROAD. As a sample of the opinions expressed by the editors who visited Astoria during recent week, the following from Editor Notter, of the Portland Dispatch, is quoted: 'The work of constructing the Astoria railroad is progressing rapidly. Last Sunday the first train went out of Astoria to Seaside, and while traffic has not been opened, the city is now virtually connected with the seashore. There is noticeable activity at Flavel, where the iron for the road is being discharged and the erection of an elegant hotel building is being pushed to completion as fast as possible. This structure is a model of architecture and beautiful in design, and has all the modern improvements. It is the purpose of the company to open the hotel as soon as completed, and it is to be on the first-class order. The company also proposes to erect at this place an elevator, warehouses, turn tables, and machine shops. It is to be the terminus of the road, and as the company has large landed interest at this point, there can be no doubt but what there will be quite a city in the near future at Flavel. There is a good harbor in front of this place with deep water, and there is no reason why the expectations of the promoters of this enterprise should not be realized. Flavel is situated on a fine tract of land, being perfectly level and surrounded by beautiful parks. It is the intention of the company to improve and beautify these grounds. The distance between Astoria and Flavel by rail is so short that they are virtually one, and no doubt they will both reap a mutual benefit by this enterprise. The German bark Assel, which cleared at the custom house yesterday for Liverpool, says the San Francisco News, left last night for Noyo in tow of the steam schooner Noyo, to load a cargo of clear redwood lumber. The Assel is an iron bark of 762 tons net register, built at Glasgow in 1876, and is the first foreign bark to load a lumber cargo at an outside port on the Pacific coast. There being no custom house at Noyo, the vessel had to enter and clear at this port and then go up there and take on her cargo. When the Assel left home on her present voyage she flew the British flag, but before or after she arrived at Guaymas she was sold to the Germans and now flies Emperor Wilhelm's ensign. The very inefficient manner in which flour is usually packed, for export on the Oriental steamers, will not stand the wear and tear of a re-shipment after reaching the end of the first ocean trip. The flour sacks are often broken open in handling. The on-carrying lines will no longer grant clean receipts on flour in ordinary sacks. They accept flour for ports beyond Hongkong only on the condition that the sacks are enclosed in strong gunny bags. The Northern Pacific Steamship Company has issued a circular from the Tacoma office stating it can only accept flour for ports beyond Hongkong on clear bills of lading on the condition that it is packed as specified above. Otherwise the flour will be carried but must bear the following clause across the bill of lading: 'Northern Pacific steamer and connecting steamer, or steamers, not responsible for ship damage, or breakage of bags or loss of contents, however caused.' Besides its immense flour shipments to Asiatic ports, the Northern Pacific line is working up a large trade with Australian and South African ports via Hongkong on transfer. This order means much to state millers who are reaching out for business in Africa and the Antipodes.—Ledger.
