THE WORK AT KNAPPA

The following from the Astorian's special correspondent at Knappa, gives some idea of the magnificent work being done on the railroad:
Railroad work at Knappa and above and below is progressing steadily. From Big Creek to Hilltop Slough, a distance of two miles, five separate gangs of men are at work on the grade.

HOMICIDE AT SPOKANE

Spokane, Sept. 11.—J. H. Buckman, one of the most prominent farmers in Lincoln county, was killed near here last evening by Walter Fairman. A threshing crew was at work on Buckman's place, and Fairman was measuring the grain. Deceased accused Fairman of swindling, and Fairman called him a liar. The latter struck Fairman, who retaliated by knocking Buckman down. He then jumped upon the prostrate form of Buckman, and choked him until he cried for help. Buckman walked away apparently satisfied with the thrashing he had received. About ten minutes later, as Fairman was measuring the grain, he looked up and saw Buckman coming toward him with a knife. To protect himself Fairman grabbed a pitchfork. Spectators say Buckman made a rush at Fairman with the uplifted knife, when he raised the pitchfork, and struck Buckman a blow over the head with the handle. Buckman fell like a log, the blood rushing from his ears, nose and mouth. Without recovering consciousness Buckman expired within half an hour. Fairman was locked up in the jail here. He expresses much sorrow at the fatal termination of the quarrel, and says he had no intention whatever to kill Buckman but was forced to strike him to protect his own life.

LI HUNG CHANG

Expresses His Views of Silver and Cleveland.
Banff, N. W. T., Sept. 11.—Dr. Horsley, representative of the Canadian government, had an interview with Li Hung Chang while en route here. In discussing financial affairs, the viceroy asked many questions and in turn was asked for his opinion on the silver question in the United States. He said: "My opinion is no doubt different from yours, because I look at it from a Chinese standpoint. If a silver president is elected in the United States it will benefit China in that it will raise the value of silver money and in like measure, of course, it will benefit all great silver nations." "Do you think," he was asked, "that the election of a silver president will make the silver dollar worth as much as a gold dollar?" "No, but it would make it worth more than it is at present."

ESTIMATED MAINE MAJORITY

Augusta, Me., Sept. 11.—J. H. Manley, chairman of the Republican state committee, tonight summarized the situation in Maine thus: "We shall throw (in Monday's election) the largest Republican vote ever thrown... We shall give the largest majority ever given in a presidential year." Manley points out that the largest majority the Republicans have had in the September elections in presidential years was 19,815, in 1892, and shows how much smaller it was in the other years.
