CASTORIA

The little schooner Surprise, of Astoria, sailed from Tolstoi bay, Alaska, September 28, for this port with 250 barrels of salted salmon. She should have called at Victoria several weeks ago, but has failed to put in an appearance, and fears are entertained for her safety.

According to the annual report of Commodore Chadwick, chief of naval equipment, the war ships last year burned 116,902 tons of coal, costing \$420,131, and of this amount \$1,741 tons were purchased abroad. Only 45 per cent of this fuel was used for steaming purposes, the remainder being consumed for auxiliaries, including electric lighting, ventilation, etc.

All the Yokohama tea merchants, says the Chugai Shogyo, came to an agreement on October 6 in connection with the proposal to establish a bank for furthering the special interests of their trade. The agreement provides that every merchant shall put aside 10 yen for each picul of tea that is sent to him.

One of the grandest sights ever seen at the mouth of the Oregon was witnessed yesterday when six large ships, with every stitch of canvas set, sailed into port. They were the Royal George, Portland, Persia, Cambrian Princess, Machrihanish and Criffie. They crossed in about thirty minutes apart, and driven by a stiff southwest, presented a sight that baffles description.

The Northern Pacific Steamship Company will add another boat to its line. The British steamer Macduff, 1822 tons, now at Hongkong, has been chartered and will sail from the Orient about December 1. She will leave here on the return passage about December 15 or 20.

The steamer Alice Blanchard sailed yesterday for San Francisco with 205,000 feet of lumber and 2000 bundles of shooks. The barkentine Portland arrived yesterday from San Francisco. She will load lumber at the Willamette Lumber Co.'s mills.

The British ship Pelorus arrived down the river yesterday. She has 125,066 bushels of wheat, valued at \$22,500, for the United Kingdom. The British ship Cambrian Princess, 1350 tons, Captain Jones, arrived yesterday, 113 days from Santos, in ballast. She will load wheat.

The steamship State of California arrived yesterday from San Francisco with a large quantity of freight. After discharging here, she left up the river. The British ship Machrihanish, 1541 tons, in ballast, arrived in port yesterday after an exceptionally good run of eighty-nine days from Rio. She will load wheat.

The British ship Royal George, 1604 tons, Captain Taggart, arrived in port yesterday, 117 days from Rio. She has 800 tons of stone ballast and will load wheat. She leaves up the river today.

The British ship Persian, Captain Carnegie, in ballast, arrived yesterday, thirty-eight days from Nagasaki, Japan. Her run was an exceptionally good one. The German bark Magdalene made the passage from Higo in thirty-four days. The Persian and Magdalene should make a good race.
