The British ship Melanope sailed yesterday for England with a cargo of wheat.

The charter price of the Royal George, which loads wheat for England, is \$2a 6d.

The schooner Letitia, lumber laden from this port for Guaymas, arrived over November 12.

The steamer Augusta sailed yesterday for Tillamook with an assortment of general merchandise.

The lighthouse tender Columbine leaves for Destruction Island and other northern stations this morning.

The British ship Ben Lee sailed yesterday for the United Kingdom with 142,862 bushels of wheat, valued at \$106,500.

The British ship Nithsdale sailed yesterday for Queenstown and Plymouth, with 190,800 bushels of wheat, valued at \$75,900.

A three-masted ship, and a bark crossed in late last night, but it was impossible to learn their names.

The latest reports from the bark Zinita state that she is not damaged so much as was supposed and can be floated without much difficulty.

The American bark Coloma, Captain Noyes, sailed yesterday for Hongkong with 550,000 feet of lumber, valued at \$135,200, and 59 spars, valued at \$250; total value of cargo, \$135,450.

The steamship Geo. W. Elder arrived yesterday afternoon from San Francisco. Her Astoria freight consisted principally of thirty tons of coal and five tons of salt.

The lighthouse tender Manzanita arrived early yesterday morning from Gray's Harbor and took a berth at Elmore, Sanborn & Co.'s dock, where she took on about 50 tons of coal.

The steamer Harrison arrived in from Nehalem Monday evening after having been barbound at that point for some time.

The American schooner Louis, Captain Hatch, cleared yesterday for Melbourne, Australia. She carries 761,045 feet of lumber, valued at \$587,841; 116,400 laths, valued at \$232,800; and 2300 pickets valued at \$18,810; total value of cargo, \$838,451.

The government steamer Mendell yesterday towed down two barges laden with material for the concrete work at Fort Stevens.

Deputy Customs Inspector Loftus made a clever capture of smuggled opium at Seattle last night.

The schooner Herwick, which went ashore at the mouth of the Coquille river about a year ago, is again ready for service as a freight carrier.

The harbor police are looking for a pair of bold robbers who have hit upon a clever but simple plan of robbing the nickle-in-the-slot telephones.
