The monthly list of wrecks and ca sualties for September, 1896, published by Bureau Veritas, includes nine sailing vessels and two steamers employed in the Pacific Coast trade of the United States. The total number of sailing ressels reported as lost or missing is 82 of 28,993 tone net. Forty were lost by stranding, five by collision, ten by foundering, two by fire, eleven were abandoned and fourteen condemned. Two hundred and ninety-six vessels met with lesser mishaps, 85 by stranding, 66 were in collision, 5 were injured by fire, 50 sprung a leak, and 90 were injured by stress of weather. - There were eighteen steamers lost, or 14,235 tons net. Nine by stranding, 4 by collidon, 2 by fire, 2 foundered and 1 was The number which met with accidents was 297, of which 93 stranded, 72 were in collision, 5 were on fire, 6 were leaky, 58 were injured by stress of weather and 63 met with accident to engines or boilers.-San Franisco Commercial News.
