The British ship Yallaroo cleared yesterday for Paimouth for orders with a cargo of 76,771 bushels of wheat valued at \$65,000.

The steamer Columbia arrived yesterday morning, and was delayed in getting to sea, it being reported in the afternoon that she had anchored inside the bar, but this report has not been confirmed.

The British ship Butley, that left Hongkong for this port ninety-five days ago, lost a valuable charter by not being in port and ready to take her cargo by December 1, says the San Francisco Examiner.

The British ship Glencora, which was chartered prior to her arrival by some speculator during the hurry in wheat to carry grain to England at 25 shillings and 9 pence, in hopes of selling her charter at an advantage, was rechartered today and ordered to proceed to Port Costa to load grain for the United Kingdom.

The United States steamship Bennington is expected to sail for Salvador today, says the Chronicle of Saturday. Her mission is one of survey of the mouth of the Choctawhatchee river, with a view of the construction near there of a sea pier and docks by a San Francisco commercial company.
