

Captain McKengie, of the Heathfield, stated that he was with Captain Davies in Kobe, Japan, for a month, that he met him every day, that he knew him forward man. He was not given to exeasive drinking, and he never knew him to be under the influence of liquor, It is the general opinion of not only the senfaring men here, but those wh have known Davies in the past, that his present trouble must have been caused by drugging, and that the captain did not have a fair deal. When or how such an incident could have occurred no one knew or was prepared to say, but all were agreed that there was something mysterious in the case, and all grieved over the loss of a good seaman, and were in deep sympathy with the widow and children left alone in
