A British Ship Captain Relates Facts From Unwritten History.

UNCLE SAM TO THE RESCUE

Under Protection of His Cruisers 1773 Britishers Believed—The British Navy Inactive

The following remarkable story told by a British sea captain of his experience in the harbor of Rio, during the late attempt to restore monarchial government in Brazil...

It is believed that what is here published constitutes, in all its details, a new chapter in the history of that rebellion which has never been published before...

Captain Corbhill, of the British ship Crown of India, now lying in this harbor awaiting charter, was one of eighty British shipsmen who were tied up in that harbor, neither able to discharge or to get out of the port...

The scenes and incidents in Rio harbor during the rebellion were the most awful and exciting I ever witnessed, and but for the good offices of the United States navy...

You see when our ships sailed from home with orders to stop at Rio to discharge or take on cargo there was no news of the war, and we kept dropping in there innocently until before the cessation of operations...

Our anchorage was between two forts which were about two miles apart and whose searchlights played on us by night and whose guns menaced us by day...
