Comptroller Eckles is the authority for the statement that only 13 out of total of 5,680 national banks have falled within the past few months, as the result of bad management, combind with the long continued financial and adustrial depression. Since the adopion of the national banking system nore than thirty years ago, 5,953 national banks have been established, of which only 323 have failed or gone into the hands of receivers. This is at the rate of less than ten a year. The books of the comptroller's office show that these 323 failed banks paid an average of 75 per cent of all indebtedness, while he note holders have not lost a dolfar. Whatever defects may adhere in the national banking system unsoundness not one of them. Negligent or disnest management will wreck any other business corporation. It is impossible by any system of legal safeguards to prevent business disaster through oad management, and national banks whose directors do not direct or whose officers steal or speculate will come to grief in time, but this is equally true of any other corporate or individual business concern. Honesty and capability in management are the essentials of success in any calling, and in sanking no less than in any other. but the comptroller's figures show that he national banks have suffered as little at the hands of negligent directors

When people wanted anything they knelt down and prayed for it. However, that was some time ago. Along about 1600 a fellow named Gutenberg, who had "come de Rhine over," was monkeying around a carpenter shop in Lentz. He whittled some little blocks and actually made an alphabet. Then he rigged a sort of—well, a machine that would look something like our leta sort of-well, a machine that would look something like our letter press of today. He arranged his blocks in order, put some ink on them, also a piece of paper, and then screwed his press down. That was called printing. Old Gutenberg made a howling success of the racket, and his head became so swollen that he really snubbed the king one day. The king overlocked it, however, for he had an idea what kind of fellows printers would be. Well, finally they got the printing system down pat, and, as the centuries rolled by, began printing newspapers—first person, invariably singular number, any gender and hard case.

## In This

There are many newspapers—as a matter of fact. But it is an utter impossibility to get a newspaper to admit it.
