The regulations governing vessels employed in fur seal fishing and seal hunting during the season of 1897, have just been received at the San Francisco custom house. The only changes notable are the following articles.

Every vessel employed in sea otter hunting or in transporting sea otter parties, shall have, in addition to the papers now required by law, a special clearance and license. These regulations apply only to American vessels.

The market is practically without any particular change of note. It is stated that some bids have been made for next seasons Columbia river, but so far as we are advised without leading business. Advice from up-north state that a report is current that a cannery is to be built at Astoria with a daily capacity of 2,000 cases of 48 pounds each.
