

The annual returns of shipping at Flootwood, which have just been is sued, do not indicate that upward tendency which it was confidently predicted a year ago would take place. The reverse rather-especially in regard to the foreign trade-is the case. The number of vessels inwards from foreign ports in 1896 was 149 as compared with against 171,604, showing a decrease of 18 vessels and 21,202 tons. Outwards to foreign ports the number of yessels and the amount of tonnage was 73 and 48, 329, as against 85 and 63,732 respectively in 1895. The figures for the coasting tes-Conn Drug Store. trade are much the same as 1895, being as follows: Inwards, with cargoes-1,031 vessels; tonnage, 220,904; outwards, 1201 vessels; tonnage, 234,644. HOW IT WORKS.

The Inter-State Commerce Act may have benefited the Middle West, but it has prevented the great terminal points of the Atlantic and the Pacific doing business over the American roads. Permitting the bonding system, however, has completed the work, and by assistance of the United States government in perpetrating these two acts. the Canadian Pacific Railroad and steamship line is prospering at the expense of American railroads and steamships. If Uncle Sam offered a direct bonus to the Canadian system in lieu of the business now obtained from American merchants simply because they are forced to it, in all probability it would be declined, the present indirect largess being more profitable. Not being bound by any interstate law of long haul, short haul, etc., the Canadian Pacific can, and is, carrying flour manufactured in Manitoba and other far distant eastern points to Australia, and delivering it in competition with Pacific coast products. Cotton, if not from New Orleans, from Charleston, destined for Japan, has een sent all the way around the United States and over our northern neighbor's military line, instead of by the direct route through this country.
