

MARINE NEWS.

arrived yesterday from Seattle with inety tons of coal The cargo of the City of Madras as

of 2,325 tons of coal, all for Portland. The cargo of the steamer Elmore as entered at the custom house shows salmons, butter, eggs, hides and produce to the full capacity of the vessel.

The tug Relief yesterday picked up one of the anchors and sixty fathorus chain lost Sunday by the Tam O'Shanter, and returned the same to that vessel, which is now lying at Parker's dock.

Tillamook trade seems to be increasing.

The British ship Persian is making good headway loading lumber at Knappton. Captain Carnegie now has 600,000 feet of lumber aboard, and still has between four and five hundred thousand to take on.

There was un inciplent mutiny on poard the schooner Albion yesterday norning which prevented that vessel from going to sea. The crew, consistclined to turn to at the command of the captain, claiming that the vessel was unseaworthy and that they had been hardly treated. All attempts to adjust the matter falled, and when it was found that the expense of having the men arrested under United States warrants would cost more than the advance in wages demanded, the captain immediately agreed to pay each man fifteen dollars more for the voyage, which at once stopped the leaks in the vessel, and she was towed out last evening by the Occident.

Another catastrophe similar to the wreck of the Blairmore was narrowly averted at the Oceanic dock on Thursday afternoon, when the British ship Forfarshire, lightened of nearly all her cargo of coal, came near "turning turtle" in her berth. She did turn half over on her beam, two steel cables snapping under the enormous strain which pulled her bitts out. Fortunately, the other cables held and she was braced up strong and tight until sufficlent ballast had been placed again in The matter was kept very quiet, but it leaked out yesterday and was the talk of the water front. The Forfarshire has been alongside the steamer Monowai for several days discharging coal into the steamship. The Monowai usually carries enough coal for the round trip. but this time her freight was so heavy that about half of her coal space was reserved for it. The Forfarshire was moored alongside in an outside berth and the coal discharged directly from the ship in the steamer. In order to save the expense of shifting the ship she was moored with extra care, and by any Substitute even the ballast coal discharged, the intention being to ballast her from lighters after she was through discharging.
