

It looks as if the captain and crev of the German ship Britannia are hav ing a little junketing trip at the expense, and through the actions, of the wenrs. When the vessel discharged at Caleta Buena freights were very low there, and the owners cabled the captain to proceed in ballast to San ranolsco, where freingts were comparatively good. The Britannia arrived here two months and a half ago, but freight rates were nnot booming then, and she has laid here since awaiting a charter. Nothing worth taking has turned up, and the owners have cabled the captain to take his ship to Chili again, in ballast, to lond nitrate for Enrope. The Britannia cleared Saturday for Iquique, so another trip of about 6,000 miles of steamer's course s before the captain and crew in ballast. While the vessel was on the way here her owners were offered il 8s 6d grain freight for her U. K., but FOR refused it. Another ship, of the same nationality, did better. She went from Montevideo to Iquique in ballast. When the captain arrived off that port he found that having made a long trip around the Horn his time forl oading had pretty near expired, so he commenced to throw his ballast overboard to help in on his loading. He had got TEMPLE LODGE NO. 7, A. F. and all out but 300 tons when a tugboat came out and gave him orders to proceed to San rancisco, as freights were very low at Iquique. He squared away STEAMERS and started up, made a quick trip of 49 days, considering the amount of ballast he had on board, and on the way was chartered for wheat to U. K. Havre, Antwerp or Dunkirk at the ate of 41 7s 6d. The captain and own-

ers of the vessel are satisfied. The British ship Helga, which arrived here in bailast from Cape Town, leaves this week in ballast for Manlia, where it is supposed and hoped she has a charter to load for New York .-San Francisco Commercial News.
