MARINE NEWS.

The Henry Villard is reported outside

The tug Rellef was yesterday engaged n blowing boilers. Captain Randall says that he will be able to put to sea in a day or two.

The movements on the waterfront centerday were few and faw between. Even the visiting captains could not scare up any excitement.

The Alaska Packers' Association has re-elected the present managers and board of directors. Their report shows If you've got something to sell, that last year's work netted a fair surplus. The association will send out a large salmon fleet next spring, and increased profits are expected.

Shipping men are beginning to wonder what has become of the schooner Aida, now out 57 days from Shanghai for this port to load lumber. On her tast trip over the schooner, in command Captain Anderson, reached Port Talk about it; that's the way, Townsend in 28 days, one of the quickest pasages on record. She sailed from this port on Soptember 21 last and arrived at Shanghai in 58 days, but she was then heavily loaded with lumber. On the return trip she sailed December 1 and has now been 57 days on the voyage which see has made loaded in that length of time and which she has covered in about half the number of days when returning.-Colonist.

President Cleveland on the 20th signed a bill which provides that all vessels above fifteen tons burden, requiring engineers and pilots, carrying freight or passengers for hire, and propelled by gas, fluid, naphtha or electric motors, shall be made subject to all Federal laws relating to the inspection of hulls and botters, and providing that all such vessels shall be made to conform to all Federal laws relating to the regulation of steam vesesis passing each other, and to such further regulations regarding fog signals, lights, and steering and sailing rules, as the board of supervising inspectors of steam vessels shall deem necessary.

Captain Gracie, of the British ship Falkland, now lying at Port Townsend, is in the city. The captain said: "I do not expect to throw the canvas of next grain shipping season. Charter rates on tonnage from the Pacific coast are so low that the owners of my vessel prefer not to have the craft moving, at the price. The British ships Balmoral and Duncow are also at Port Townsend, under orders to lie up for the same cause. At Port Angeles the British ship Andrina is laid up for the same reason. There are other ships in Puget Sound and British Columbia waters. I understand, in similar circumstances. My people do not desire to take lumber charters from the Sound. They are too low for a paying proposition."-Ledger.




