A square-rigger was reported outside yesterday noon. The Chilkat put to sea at 9 o'clock yesterday morning. The steamer Harrison put to sea yesterday at 10:30 in the morning. The schooner Jennie Estella arrived in yesterday from San Francisco. The schooner Albion, having adjusted all her difficulties, put to sea in tow of the Occident. The tug Oklahoma left down last night and will today tow the Henry Villard up the river. The steamer Eldor will arrive down from Portland Saturday morning with a cargo of potatoes for California. After taking the Albion to sea, the steamer Occident returned to this port where she will remain for several days. The Swanhillda, which is supposed to have on board the Australian murderer, Butler, is well known in this port, as is also Captain Frazer. The steamer State sailed yesterday morning at 8 o'clock with a large freight and passenger list for San Francisco. Collector C. H. Page yesterday received a telegram from the department stating that the revenue cutter Commodore Perry will not be in Astoria in the near future, and perhaps not at all this season, as she has been ordered to the ground for duty. Whose fine Italian band? The American ship Henry Villard, Captain F. W. Patten, arrived in port yesterday. She brings a very large cargo from New York for Portland, and will go up river today. She was formerly in the Sutton & Beebe line, but since the failure of that company is now under orders to the Charles F. Beebe Company, Portland, and was shipped by Dearborn & Co., New York. The Villard carries a crew of twenty-one men, and Captain Patten has his wife with him on this voyage. The captain said last night that he left New York on September 22nd, arriving off the Columbia February 1st, making the voyage in 132 days, which is one of the quickest passages on record. He states that he had fine northerly winds for eight days after sailing, and that then he had a poor chance to reach the equator in the Atlantic. From New York to the equator it took forty days; from the equator to Cape Horn thirty-six days; from Cape Horn to the equator in the Pacific thirty-eight days. No severe weather was experienced on the trip, and all hands are reported well. The Villard has a full cargo of groceries, lye, nails, iron, pig iron, machinery, steel, liquors, cotton waste, etc., for Portland firms.

SWANHILDA'S SAILING TIME. Now Out Sixty-Six Days, but Not Yet Overdue. San Francisco Call. Sixty-six days today since the Swanhillda left Newcastle, and still no sail in sight to indicate the coming of Butler, the Australian murderer. This does not necessarily mean an unusual delay, as the average passage is nearer seventy than sixty days. The fastest sailing trip on record from Newcastle to San Francisco is forty-four days, made by the English ship Lord Canning. It once took the American bark J. D. Peters 124 days to make the passage and the English ship Hahneman was out 115 days before she came into this port. The Swanhillda is a fine, long, four-masted bark, and on her last trip from Newcastle came up in fifty-eight days. It is known, however, that the Swanhillda is now very foul with grass and barnacles. This condition makes a very considerable difference in her speed. On her recent passage from Cape Town, South Africa, she was fifty days in sailing the course usually covered in thirty-five or forty days. The bottom had become foul after a three months' stay at Cape Town, and it has not been scraped since. The brisk southeast wind that has been blowing for several days off the coast may be expected to bring the Swanhillda into port any time now, if she is reasonably near here. But for all that has been said by any of the ships that have arrived already the Swanhillda may be very far away, the victim of contrary winds or of calms.
