River captains report that the Wil amette and Columbia rivers are now high. The steamer Chittagong, drawing 22 feet of water, was enabled to come down yesterday with very little difficulty. It is thought that the river will continue to rise steadily.

It was reported yesterday afternoon that the Henry. Villard had gone aground on the Washington shore, above Brookfield. The down river bont, however, reported having sighted the Villard plowing across the bay at a good rate of speed. The Villard left here yesterday morning, in tow of the

The Norwegian steamer Florida will Out. eave Portland this morning for Astoria in ballast, bound for Comax, B. where she will load coal for San Prancisco. She expected to have seoured a cargo of flour at Portland for Australia, but it is reported that the mills did not get enough wheat to

The brig John D. Spreckles made the quickest run of the season so far from Hawaii to San Francisco. She brought a cargo of sugar for the refinery, and as the wind was fair, Captain Chris tensen took no chances, but sailed in through the Golden Gate and took his vessel up the bay "under a wrap," but nevertheless at a speed that was fast enough to distance the custombouse and quarantine boats and also the tug boats. Off the Oregon dock Captain Christensen took in sail and the tug Alert caught the brig and towed her to the refinery.-San Francisco Call.

The British steamship Chittagong, Captain Corfield, arrived down yesterday in charge of Pilot Smith. She cleared at the custom house a large cargo of miscellaneous freight, including the following articles: 500 quarter sucks of flour, valued at \$531.25; 67,420 quarter sacks of flour, \$68,000; 400 quar ter sacks of flour, \$429; 6,000 quarter sacks of flour, \$6,727.50; 379 sacks bran, \$202.50: 305 sacks oats, \$390.45; 2393 sacks bran, \$909.95; 450 sacks shorts, \$252; 100 sacks middlings, \$125; 82 sacks wheat \$169.67; 460 sacks rolled barley, \$340.04; 698 sacks whole barley, \$691.82; 43 sacks outs, \$46; 12 bales of hay, \$16.28; 64 sacks bran, \$27; 2576 sacks flour, \$2,705.
