The new twin screw freight and passenger steamer Pennsylvania, of the Hamburg-American line, was placed in tween New York and Hamburg Februsey 20. She left that port on the next day with a full cargo, carrying a total of 18,500 tons. This is the largest cargo that was ever taken out of New York in one ship, or for that matter the greatest that any ship is any part of the world has carried. To form at this amount of freight represents i is interesting to note that it would take 616 freight cars or about eighteen freight trains to transport 4t. Among its miscettaneous cargo the Pennsylvania carries 294,069 bushels of grain. equaling 6,847 tons, which is in itself more than the average freight steamer can take if completely filled. The Pennsylvania is constructed not only for the transportation of freight, but also of passengers. Her passenger accommodations are first-class. A stster ship of the Pennsylvania, the Pretoria, is now in the docks in the yards of Blohn & Voss. in Hamburg.
