The steamer Signal will arrive down from Portland this morning.

The steamer Queen yesterday started the British ship Helianus up the river from the upper bay.

The two pilot schooners, Jessie and San Jose, anchored side by side inside the O. R. & N. dock, presented a novel and handsome sight yesterday afternoon.

The steamer Telephone left up on time for Portland last evening, but when about half way across the upper bay from Tongue Point, was obliged to turn back to the city on account of the severity of the westerly gale. Her bell was blown from its fastenings, but barring a few other slight accidents, she suffered no injury.

There is \$16,569,342 worth of naval work in progress in the United States shipyards. This is for hull and machinery, the armor and armament being additional. The two Japanese battleships which are to be built at San Francisco and Philadelphia will swell the total to over \$20,000,000. Of the \$16,569,342 worth of naval vessels, the Newport News Company have work aggregating \$7,655,000, or nearly half. Two years ago there was a little over \$15,000,000 worth of work in private shipyards.

During the year 1896, 99,225 cabin passengers, and 252,350 steerage passengers landed in New York, all coming from foreign countries. They were brought in on 822 trips, made by vessels of 21 lines, and 39 trips by miscellaneous steamers. The North German Lloyd Steamship Company brought 28,034 steerage passengers from Bremen, and 18,146 from Mediterranean ports. The Hamburg-American line brought 27,280 steerage passengers from Hamburg and 3,581 from Mediterranean ports; the White Star line landed 21,220 steerage passengers; the Cunard, 20,000; the Anchor line, 18,839 from the Mediterranean ports, and 6,448 from Glasgow; the French line, 17,371; and the American line, 12,830. Of cabin passengers, the American line brought 18,839; Cunard, 17,999; Hamburg-American, 12,172 from Hamburg, and 428 from Mediterranean ports; North German Lloyd, 10,921 from Bremen and 2,634 from Mediterranean ports, and the White Star line 11,607.
