The steamer Fanny arrived down the river yesterday, with a large quantity of railroad ties.

The steamship State of California arrived yesterday morning from San Francisco, and after discharging freight here, proceeded up the river.

The steamer Occident cleared yesterday for Nehalem with an assortment of general merchandise. She did not sail yesterday, on account of the weather, but will probably leave out today.

The steamer Signal arrived down the river yesterday and cleared for San Francisco with four hundred thousand feet of lumber consigned to the Hill Lumber Company. She will probably sail today.

A glance at the "Vessels Owned on the Pacific Coast," recently issued by the Commercial Publishing Company, will show that there are a large number of vessels on this coast whose names are duplicated. The practice of repeating names of vessels often causes trouble, and ought, in fact, to be prohibited by United States statutes, following the postoffice department law in respect to towns located in the same state.

Among the marine mishaps recently noticed is that to the Gipsy steamer. A press dispatch from Pacific Grove, Cal., dated March 6, says: "At 10 a. m. the Pacific coast steamship Gipsy became disabled while attempting to leave Moss Landing in a heavy sea and strong gale of wind. Her cables fouled her propeller. Fortunately, the steamship Santa Cruz was there, and towed her to Monterey, where she arrived at 3:30 p. m., and where it is hoped the propeller can be freed."
