It wants to be understood, seriously and positively, by the members of the police commission that some explanation is required relative to their sudden and sweeping move on the gambling and sporting fraternity of Astoria yesterday. The verdict of the city council understands that it is no more against the law or public decency for these people to ply their vocation today, the 19th day of March, than it was on yesterday, last week, last month, last year, or all the other years their class has been allowed to go unmolested; and the rumor that the action of the commission was inspired by a spirit of retaliation against the city for the reduction in police salaries, approved yesterday morning by the mayor, is too grave a matter to be lightly passed over. The members of the police commission have hitherto enjoyed the confidence and esteem of all classes in the community, and the monstrous perversion of public power and duty implied in this charge demands an explicit defense, and that at once from Mr. Gordon and his associates. Whatever may be the merits of the salary-reduction question, law-abiding citizens will not sustain such trifling with the dignified and important responsibilities belonging to the office of the police commission as a way to meet it. That kind of juggling and manipulation of the laws designed to regulate and promote public morality and good order must not be tolerated in Astoria. Such a course inevitably tends to official corruption of the worst kind, and would soon produce in Astoria a state of disrespect for the law, and those charged with the duty of enforcing it, as would be perilous and disgraceful. We want no Boss Tweed or Tammany methods in this city—no matter by whom they are introduced, nor how apparently harmless their object. The members of the police commission ought to be the last men connected with the city government to set such an example.

Henry Clew's letter for March 13th says: Affairs in Wall street are still following a process of fermentation and development which, though not universally seen or understood, is steadily working towards better conditions and higher values. The truth is that people are awakening to the conviction that the last four years of depression has not been due solely to our monetary troubles, but that its causes have run deep into our whole business structure. There has been an earthquake disturbance of the general basis of business, affecting almost every form of capital and investment, and helping to produce the paralysis of production and the interruption of trade of which we have had such a sorry experience. The special underlying cause has been the extraordinary increase in plant and in the general capacity for production arising from the progress of invention within the last twenty or twenty-five years. The undue expansion of production from this cause has produced a decline in prices which affects everybody and every interest. To the wage-earning classes, it has brought many great advantages; but to the owners of large capitals it has meant a decline in the value of almost every kind of property they hold. Capital has therefore been less sought for employment and has yielded smaller returns or none at all; and its owners have been very cautious about how they employed it. Every interest has thus been smitten with stagnation, and few have understood what it meant or where to look for remedy;

they have simply stood still and waited for light. Of course, this condition of things has been very greatly aggravated by the fears excited by the silver movement and by the disturbing political symptoms that have been developed by the elections. We had a similar and about equally protracted reaction following the panic of 1884, arising from similar causes; but that first shock of these earthquake disturbances was far less severe than the one from which we have been suffering since 1892.
