The steamer Grady made her first trip down from Portland this morning.

The steamer Galt was detained yesterday evening by a heavy freight list, much of it being consigned to canneries along the river.

Pilot Gardner was Tuesday put aboard the British ship Glenelg in the offing, and it is expected will bring her into the harbor in a few days.

The steamer State of California had quite an experience coming into the harbor yesterday morning. An ugly sea was running—one of the worst Captain Green ever saw at the mouth of the river. Two big seas came up from the south and struck the ship in quick succession. The first one slapped up against the purser's window and the second one broke the glass and entered the room, drenching everybody, including the purser in his night robe, and spilling a lot of way bills. Beyond drenching a few other persons and washing down decks, little damage was done. She brought up a large cargo of general merchandise for Astoria and Portland.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

Notice is hereby given of the following changes in the buoyage of this district, which affect the list of buoys, cones, buoys and day marks, Pacific coast, 1895.

Cook bay bar, Oregon, page 36; North Spit buoy No. 1. This buoy, which has been heretofore reported adrift, and which was formerly a black first-class con, marking the outer submerged end of the North spit jetty, was replaced March 13, 1897, by a black second-class con buoy moored about one-fourth mile west northwest three-fourths west from the position of the former buoy. The buoy is now in 17 feet of water and marks the extremity of the sand spit making out from the outer submerged end of the North spit jetty. Its bearings are: Cape Arago lighthouse, south southeast one-fourth west; Yokam point, south; Guano rock, east southeast three-eighths east. Vessels should not pass between this buoy and the outer buoy.

Columbia river, channel over Walker island bar to Martin Island, page 18. The following changes have been made to mark the recently dredged channel across Cottonwood island shoal:

Rainier buoy No. 1. A black first-class spar buoy was established March 26, 1897, in twenty-four feet of water, to mark the edge of the spit off the lower end of Cottonwood island, and should be given a berth of one hundred feet. The bearings are as follows: Rainier wharf west southwest one-half west; Dobbelower Landing post light, southeast one-fourth east. Cottonwood island shoal buoy No. 2. A black first-class spar buoy was established March 26, 1897, in twenty-two feet of water, and should be given a berth of 50 feet. The bearings are as follows: East end of Cottonwood island east one-fourth south; Coffin rock light south southeast three-fourths east; Dobbelower Landing post light west three-fourths north.

Cottonwood island shoal buoy No. 5. On March 26, 1897, the number of this buoy was changed from 1 to 5. This buoy should be given a berth of 50 feet.
