Nearly all the fishing boats were out yesterday, but so far as reported the catches were light. The fish bought by Schmidt at the Lettenweber cannery are being cleaned and packed in layers of salt, it is said, for shipment to Portland, where the fish are packed in ice and shipped east.

Prof. Vinter F. Cooper, the blind phrenologist, who was to have begun lecturing at Warrenton last evening, on account of rushing business in Astoria was obliged to postpone his Warrenton engagement until next Thursday evening. He will, therefore, remain here today and tomorrow only, and can be seen at the Mansell House, Commercial street, to which place he has removed from the Astor House.

In the circuit court yesterday the following orders were entered: Chas. Anderson vs. Astoria Packing Co. and M. J. Kinney; judgment rendered on the verdict. State of Oregon vs. Joseph Terry, jointly indicted with Jim Brownman; motion for new trial granted, and defendant sentenced to one year in the penitentiary and sixty days allowed in which to file a bill of exceptions. The remaining jurors were discharged for the term. Dandel McDonald, a native of Great Britain, and Leak Yezelin, a native of Sweden, were admitted to United States citizenship. Andrew Young vs. Gabriel H. Peterson; judgment and decree of foreclosure entered.

Among the distinguished visitors Sunday from Portland were Mr. H. L. Durham, vice president of the Commercial National bank, and General C. P. Beebe, of the Oregon National Guard. The general said that he was delighted with the improvements being made in and around Astoria, and that he predicted for this season a greatly enlarged seaside trade. First because there was promise of a much better season so far as weather is concerned, and second because the great convenience afforded to travelers by the new railroad service, the trains running direct from Astoria to all points on the south beaches, would attract many more pleasure seekers who would not ordinarily have put up with the inconveniences of the old system.

MARINE NEWS.

The steamer Elmore left out Sunday for Tillamook.

The schooner Gen. Olson, Captain, cleared yesterday for San Francisco with 210,000 feet of lumber.

The British bark Reliance, Captain Robinson, cleared yesterday for Port Angeles in ballast for orders.

The steamer Alliance entered Sunday from San Francisco bound to Portland with a cargo of barley.

The Manzanita will leave this morning for the lights, where she landed a lot of coal. Tomorrow she will go to Shoalwater bay to get a new buoy.

The British steamer Amaraopora, Captain Cameron, arrived down from Portland yesterday and immediately cleared for Honolulu via Victoria and Sound ports. She carried a large general cargo valued at \$12,256.02.

The steamer Monowal arrived from Australia and Honolulu yesterday afternoon crowded with passengers. Every berth was filled and between thirty and forty people were left behind at Honolulu, who wanted to secure passage to this port. The vessel brought a number of notables. The Lord Primates of Australia, the Chief Justice of Hawaii, the Australian base ball players, Cavill, the world's champion swimmer, and Emily Soldeva, the noted opera singer. Being among the number. The cargo of the Monowal was so badly mixed as the passenger list, as it contained a large consignment of onions a novel shipment from Australia, 157 bunches and 25 boxes of bananas, of which there is a very short crop this season, several cases of oil paintings, tin, ammuno and sugar. The Monowal is now in port for the last time. As soon as she returns to Sydney she will be put on the coast run and the steamer Moana will take her place. The Moana is an elegant, large vessel, being 1500 tons more than the Monowal. She will be the largest steamer running to this port, and is said to be remarkably fast. Captain Carver will stay on the Monowal, as his family lives in Australia. Those who have had dealings with the officers of the Monowal were very much pleased yesterday to hear that Purser B. B. Bondell, Chief Engineer McCraig and Chief Officer Graham will come back in the Moana.—Chronicle.

BEEF SUGAR.

The Orange Juice Company, 32 Lafayette Place, New York, have issued a timely work entitled "Sugar, a new and Profitable Industry," etc. It is a book of 160 pages, bound in cloth and profusely illustrated. The price is 50 cents, post paid. The book shows that the best sugar industry is no longer an experiment in the United States, but that beeta much richer in sugar than those grown in Europe can be produced over vast areas in this country. The book gives an account of what has been done in the best sugar factories operated in this country during the past six or eight years. It takes the position that if Congress will insure the American market for American sugar, the United States will ere long become the greatest sugar producer in the world, thus putting into the pockets of our own farmers, capitalists and laborers, the more than \$100,000,000 now sent abroad annually for imported sugar.

Part 1, discusses the economic aspects of sugar, claiming that it is an economic crime for the United States to import sugar to the value of its entire exportation of wheat and wheat flour. In part 2, Professor Stubbs of Louisiana, gives an admirable insight into the sugar cane industry of the south, and brings out forcibly the possibilities of its development.

Part 3, is devoted to the best sugar industry in America. It first tells what has been accomplished in the United States and then shows how the industry has grown in each state. The culture of the sugar beet under American conditions is treated with great thoroughness. This is followed by an exhaustive chapter on commercial aspects of the best sugar industry including costs and profits of the best to the grower, its advantages, labor and capital, with instructions about starting sugar factories, cautions about new to the industry, etc. The author, Herbert Myrick, editor of the American Agriculturist, has endeavored to base the whole work on practical experience under American conditions in field and factory.
