County Surveyor Raymond returned yesterday and reported to the county court a re-survey of the road through the new cemetery. Viewers Stafford, Carruthers and Abbott have filed their report showing that the road will be an expensive one to build, and recommending that if the city is willing to pay the expense of re-locating a road as good as the one it has asked the county to vacate, there can be no objections to their doing so.

Inquiry among the canneries yesterday showed that the fish are still running rather light. Some boats are doing exceptionally well and others are having poor luck. Kinney yesterday received in the neighborhood of three tons, and Hawthorn about as many. The receipts at other canneries were in the same proportion. The Eureka and Epourea company has also commenced packing.

It is said that Mr. Hammond is coming to Astoria with several big corporations in his pocket which will start industries and stir up brigades in the city. The railroad contractors are daily increasing the force of men on the line and on the west side of the bay the work of improving the Seaside line is progressing well, so that a large traffic can be handled this season.

Mr. T. E. Shields, the stereoscopic lecturer, is in the city, gathering notes and views of the Astoria harbor and lower Columbia for an Eastern lecturing tour. Mr. Shields proposes to tell people all about Oregon, and show them pictures of her best scenery and business enterprises. The steamer Tillamook on her last trip in brought a large amount of freight for Astoria merchants.

News has been brought to this city of the remarkable experience of the German ship Oitka, from Brazil for Newcastle, N. S. W. The vessel was in collision with an iceberg on February 24th not far from Australia, though icebergs have not been known to come that far north before. The ship was in a dense fog, but had a good breeze and was skimming along merrily when she ran into a huge iceberg. The job-boom and bowsprit doubled up like hairpins, five plates on the port side were stove in, the foremast was nearly carried away, the steel foreyard was bent and a shower of ice in large chunks fell on the deck of the ship, forcing the sailors to seek shelter to save their lives. In a badly wrecked condition the vessel reached Sydney.
