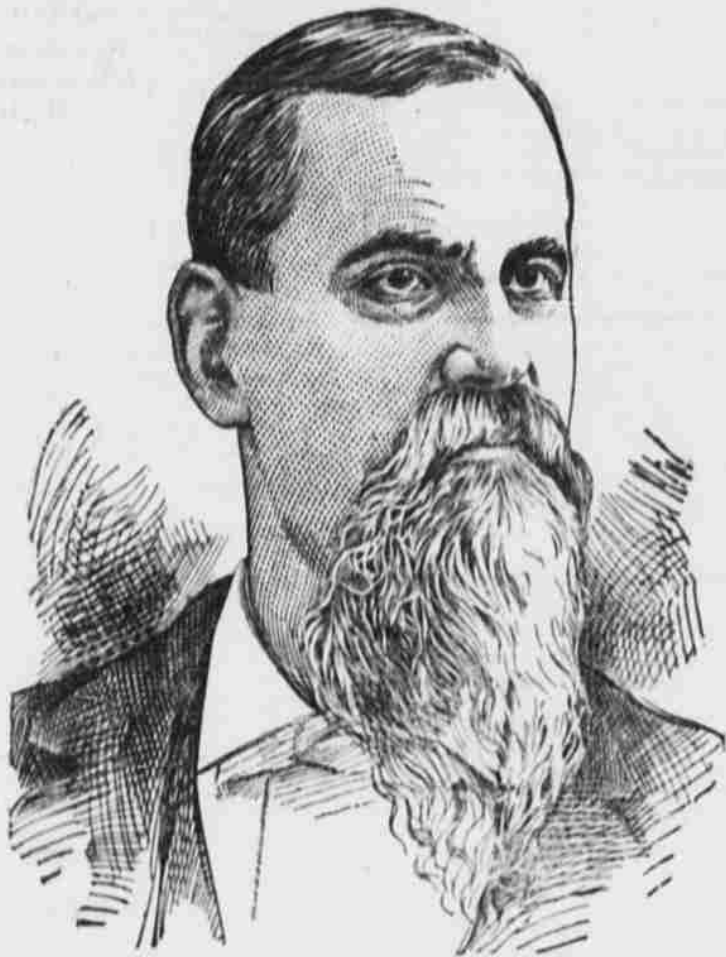

The steamer Roberts, from St. Louis, river, arrived in yesterday morning, consigned to Eimers, Sanborn & Co. Her cargo consisted of 600 cases of choice St. Louis salmon, and after discharging she will leave out today for Yaquina bay. Captain Johnson reports a smooth passage from St. Louis, with no unusual happenings.

The big whaleback collier City of Everett will leave soon for India as a relief ship. She will take a large cargo of flour, grain, and other staple provisions. The City of Everett has been running for a long time between San Francisco and Nantano in the coal trade. There is an oversupply of coal at present, and as the City of Everett was the most available steamer that could be procured there was not much trouble in securing a charter. The whaleback will leave for Calcutta in a few weeks and her appearance there will be likely to create a commotion among the natives on account of her peculiar build—Colossal.

The Tacoma Model Yacht Club will inaugurate its series of races for this season Sunday afternoon, April 19, when the first will be sailed. The start will probably be off elevator B and the finish off the club house, at the foot of McCarver street, Old Town. It is expected about eight boats will enter and a very close race is looked for. The schedule for the races during the season, as arranged by the regatta committee, is as follows: Sweepstakes races—April 18, May 30, June 13, July 11, August 5, September 12, October 2.
