To the Honorable Mayor and Common Council of the City of Astoria, Oregon:—Gentlemen: In accordance with section No. 176 of the city charter, we herewith beg leave to report the receipts and disbursements of the Astoria Water Commission for the quarter ending March 31, 1907, as follows:

The Jennie Stella will go to sea tomorrow.

The barkentine Portland did not get to sea yesterday, but will sail this morning.

The schooner Jennie Stella, Captain Krebs, cleared yesterday for Redondo with a cargo of 370,000 feet of lumber.

No less than eleven vessels full of sugar are lying idle in this port because the warehouses at the refinery are full and the work of manufacture cannot go on as fast enough to catch up with the numerous arrivals from Honolulu and Hilo. The eleven vessels have 151,744 sacks of sugar in their holds, and the captains of some are getting very anxious to go to sea again. The delayed vessels are as follows: Bark Andrew Welch, barkentine S. G. Wilder, brig W. G. Irwin and Consuelo, schooners Robert Lowers, Honolulu, H. C. Wright, Fred E. Saunders, Jessie Minor, Helen M. Kimball and Albert Meyer.—Chronicle.

The administration has instructed Minister Baker to use every effort to prevent the forfeiture of the Nicaragua Canal Concessions held by the Mar-Lime Company, and to sound the government of Nicaragua regarding its attitude toward the canal enterprise, and obtain an authoritative expression of its desires regarding the same. This sounds more definite and business-like. It is one of the principal duties of this administration to push the trans-isthmian waterway to completion, and President McKinley has gone about it with the evident intention of carrying out the pledge given in the republican platform to the people. It is really the great commercial enterprise of the world today, and its accomplishment will crown this administration with enduring glory. San Joaquin valley has a more vital interest in this waterway through which to reach Liverpool with her wheat, than perhaps has any section of the country unless it may be the lumber producing sections of the coast. Stockton will not be commercially on a proper basis until the Nicaragua Canal is constructed and a ship channel is excavated from Weber levee to the bay. When vessels can load at our warehouses and clear direct for Liverpool and Havre by the shortest possible route, then true economy in transportation will have been accomplished.—Stockton Record.
