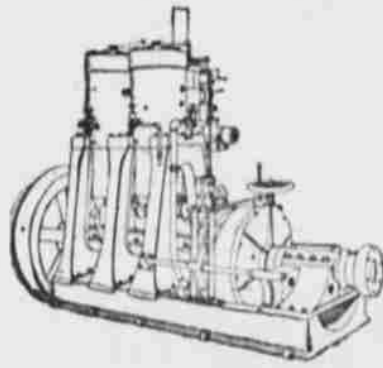

GENIUS OF THE PACIFIC

C. P. Huntington, Builder of Railroads and Cities,

TO BE THE GUEST OF ASTORIA

Will Arrive Today by the Telephone on Special Run.

HAMMOND ENTERTAINING PARTY

Portland, May 21.—C. P. Huntington, president of the Southern Pacific Railroad Co., and party arrived here today.

The genius of the Pacific railroads—the man who built the Central Pacific, the Southern Pacific, the Chesapeake & Ohio, Chesapeake & Ohio Southwestern, Oregon & California, and is now successfully operating these lines, as well as the Sunset route to New York.

Mr. Huntington is a forty-year-old, and is still one of the most active of American railroad managers.

Battle Lost Through Prince Nicholas' Cowardice and Inefficiency.

"ARMY IS LOST. SAVE US!"

So the Prince Telegraphs the King, and His Soldiers Retire in Sullen Disorder.

New York, May 21.—A special to the Journal from Athens says:

At 7 o'clock Monday evening your correspondent stood on the heights of Domokos, watching the gradual subsiding of the battle.

The Greek commander-in-chief will find it difficult to explain why, from 12 o'clock to sunset none of these batteries were sent to help the hard pressed right wing.

The advance of two regiments of Turkish sharpshooters who had shown much dardelious courage in attacking the Greek front, had been checked.

Thousands of peasants, refugees from Tessaly, in ox carts, on mules and asses, carrying every species of household furniture, mixed in the retreat.
