TARIFF BILL WORK

Good Progress Being Made in the Senate.

Washington, June 3.—The senate again made good progress on the tariff bill today, covering about 10 pages of the metal schedule and almost completing it. The formal contest against the measure was maintained, but all amendments tending to change the bill as represented were noted down and the finance committee sustained. The debate was mainly of a technical character, the republican senators continuing the policy of refraining from making speeches.

CUBAN OFFICER TESTIFIES

Washington, June 3.—Captain W. D. Smith, of the Cuban army, said to have been formerly on the staff of General Gomez, was before the subcommittee of the senate committee on foreign relations today. He supplied the committee with many details as to the strength of the insurgent forces and of their resources, and also furnished them with much information concerning the treatment of the pacificos and other residents of Cuba by the Spaniards. His testimony was strictly guarded by the committee as private.

THE VALENCIA CASE

Washington, June 3.—It is said at the state department that the firing on the Ward liner Valencia by the Spanish cruiser Maria Mercedes, at the entrance of the harbor of Guantanamo, Cuba, is under investigation.
