MARINE NOTES.

The schooner Jennie Stella left up river yesterday in tow of the "Fannie."

The barkentine Leslie D. was towed up river yesterday by the Harvest Queen.

The schooner Letitia is on the way from San Francisco for the Columbia to load lumber.

The Auroras and Seven Sisters sailed from Knappa yesterday with cargoes of lumber for California.

The steamer Columbia arrived in yesterday with a large cargo of freight and a numerous passenger list for Astoria and Portland.

The schooner Laura May, Captain Hansen, arrived in from San Diego in ballast and left up the river yesterday in tow of the Fannie.

The schooner J. R. Lewis, Captain Nielsen, arrived down from Portland yesterday and cleared for Reeds with a cargo of 280,000 feet of lumber.

The rivers will continue to fall. The fall from Umatilla west will be more rapid for the next 48 hours. At Portland the fall will be about 3/4 of a foot a day.

The rivers continue to fall. At Portland the gauge shows 27 feet, a fall of only 1/4 of a foot. A more rapid fall is now expected. The temperature is rising over the Columbia basin. It appears that the snow on the upper levels is all melted, and this being the case, a further rise is not possible.
