

IMPORTANT WORK OF THE COUNCIL

McClure Drainage Ordinance Passed Over the Mayor's Veto.

COMMERCIAL STREET MATTER

Last night the city council passed a number of very important measures, and stepped into the breach of city affairs in a manner which indicated a determination to maintain the reputation and credit of Astoria.
