Japan has given the United States to understand that nothing short of hands off will satisfy her in regard to Hawaii, while in the English house of commons the government has been interlocked as to whether it will allow so important a coaling station to be seized by the United States without protest.

Nowhere in the world are landed estates so vast as in Russia. Striking evidence thereof is furnished by the will of General Malzoff, of the czar's army, who bequeathed to his heirs, in addition to other property, no less than twenty-nine mines, fifteen of which are of the first importance. They afford employment to 80,000 men.

Now that the Fourth has come and gone, will those most interested take up the matter of the annual regatta? For three years past Astoria has done herself proud with her annual regatta, and they have become a feature looked for with interest from our neighboring cities. This year Astoria should even surpass any previous regatta held, and if the committee of '96 cannot find the time, or have not the desire to go ahead, let the A. F. C. take hold of it as they did four years ago. By all means have a regatta.

The attempt of various denominations to require abstinence from tobacco on the part of their members is now being enlarged into the school room, and a crusade against the use of tobacco has recently been started in a number of our American universities. It is a recognized fact that tobacco, when taken into the system in excessive quantities, is injurious, not only to the physical health, but to the intellectual development as well. The Boston university has issued an ordinance that those students who are unwilling to forego the use of tobacco while within the precincts of the university will have their fees returned and their names taken from the books. The Ohio Wesleyan university has made a rule forbidding its students to use tobacco in any form, and other universities have made similar ordinances.

Japan's protest against the annexation of the Hawaiian islands exposes and brings to the front of the discussion the kernel of the Hawaiian trouble—the Asiatic question. There are now in Hawaii nearly 50,000 Asiatics. Almost one-half of the population is Asiatic, equally divided between China and Japan. The dispute of the Hawaiian government with Japan before the annexation treaty was signed arose over the matter of Japanese immigration. Under the free conditions of immigration which have heretofore existed the borders of Asia would in a few years overwhelm both the natives and the white foreigners. In large measure the heavy immigration of Asiatics has been due to the American sugar exploiters, who wanted the benefit of cheap coolie labor. Now the question is, how to stop the Asiatic immigration, and the men in control of the government can see no easier way than to turn the islands over to the United States and secure the benefit of our laws against Asiatic immigration.

Victoria has not been exempt from the taint of insanity which is hereditary in her house, and at the death of her husband, thirty-three years after their marriage, she continued for several years in retirement which was not wholly that of mourning, for during that time she was subject to hallucinations. One hallucination took possession of her every time she alighted from a carriage. No one but a sturdy Scotchman, John Brown, a foolman, was able to convince her that she was not sleeping in the deepest of slumber, and it was only his strong and reassuring hand and "Na, na, yer majesty, there is no goot there" that would quiet her fears. He was during those

years a special attendant, and the ignorance of the masses as to the real condition of Victoria gave rise to the "John Brown scandal," wherein the names of the two were coupled. Her mental malady has reappeared at intervals, taking the form of despondency and moroseness, but as years have intervened since her great grief, she has been more and more free from its touch.
