Discussed in the Senate in Connection with Deficiency Bill.

MORGAN ARRAIGNS MANAGERS

His Amendment to Bill Lost—Right of Pension Claimants—Plan for Portland Contractor—Confirmations.

Washington, July 12.—A discussion of Union Pacific railroad affairs occupied the attention of the senate today. The deficiency appropriation bill was taken up early in the day, and Morgan proposed an amendment, designed to prevent the consummation of an agreement made some time since for the settlement of the government's claim against the road.

A letter received here by the last steamer from Alaska brings full particulars of the terrible death of three men, Blackstone, Hatcher and Mollique, who were frozen to death while endeavoring to carry the mail from Sunrise cove across the glacier to Prince William Sound.

COL. REND ON THE STRIKE

Thinks It Will Reach Its Greatest Strength in Ten Days.

Chicago, July 12.—Colonel W. P. Rend, the millionaire Chicago coal operator, has returned from Pittsburg, where, during the past week, he has been in conference with other coal mine operators and with the officials of the miners' organization relative to the settlement of the strike. Mr. Rend says there is no telling now whether the strike will last. He discussed the strike situation at length, and says:

"The strike has grown in size from day to day until now it has assumed vast proportions. I expect that within the next ten days it will have reached the full maturity and its greatest strength. Unless speedily settled, it threatens to be one of the formidable conflicts between labor and capital in the entire industrial history of the country."
