The proposals, after some discussion, were taken under advisement, and the British cabinet will give its answer at a subsequent conference.

It is reported this evening that an international conference will be summoned, probably to meet in the United States, with Great Britain participating. All delegates will be uninstructed with regard to the ratto, although it is well known that the United States favors 16 and France 15 1-2 to 1.
