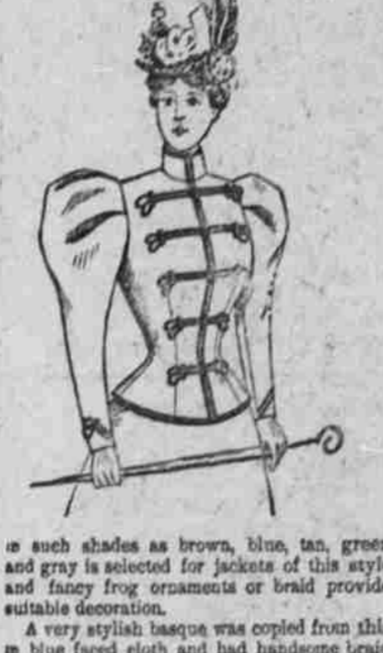

Bishop Vincent is to deliver "Founder's Day" address at the University of Chicago next month.

The next General Council of the Reformed Episcopal church will be held in Baltimore, May, 1900.

Bishop Newman began his ministry on the Cardiff circuit, Ouadous county, New York, just fifty years ago.

Bishop Fowler laid the corner-stone of Richmond avenue church in Buffalo a few days ago. It will cost \$40,000.

Dr. William Nast, the patriarch of German Methodism, celebrated his ninetieth birthday in Cincinnati a few weeks ago.

The Portland First Congregational church received six new members on July 14th, five by letter and one on confession.

The Brownville (Or.) Baptist church has called to its pastorate Rev. Mr. Davis of Alsea Valley, Or., where he was recently ordained.

Rev. J. H. Skiles, of Illinois, has become pastor of the Port Townsend Baptist church. He comes well recommended by his brethren.

Pastor H. B. Turner of the Immanuel Baptist church of Portland will make the most of his vacation by taking a trip to Alaska.

Rev. T. W. Butler, of the Congregational fold, preached at Oregon City on July 4th, and will continue to officiate there for the next three months.

Energetic committees are at work in Seattle, Tacoma, Portland, Spokane and British Columbia to secure the International Epworth League Convention for Seattle in 1899.

The ladies of Notre Dame Tabernacle Society of San Francisco are highly pleased with their efforts of the past year and have sent a handsome contribution of vestments and altar linen to Notre Dame College, San Jose.

Rev. Dr. J. C. Simmons of the Methodist Episcopal church, south, delivers in Yosemite valley the address on the fortieth anniversary of the opening of the valley to the public. He made the address at the opening forty years ago.

Referring to the length of pastorates on this coast, the Pacific Baptist says: "The longest pastorate of any denomination on this coast, so far as we have been able to learn, is that of Rev. Richard Wylie, pastor of the Presbyterian church, in Napa, Cal."

Bishop Merrill has invited the members of the recently appointed commission on confederation to meet in conference for consultation in Chicago July 21, preparatory to arranging with the commission appointed by the Methodist Episcopal church, South, for a joint meeting of the two commissions.

The second summer conference of the Young Women's Christian Association of the Pacific Coast is in session at Mills College, Cal. under the auspices of the International Y. W. C. A. This coast conference is one of the strongest of the four held in the country this year, the others convening at Northfield, Mass., Geneva, Wis., and Asheville, N. C.

Since assuming charge of the church of St. Peter and Paul, in San Francisco, the Salesian Fathers have met with commendable success in their labors. There has been a notable increase in the attendance at all the services and especially in the number of communicants. The church itself has undergone many needed improvements, new pews have been added, and the interior of the edifice been handsomely repainted.

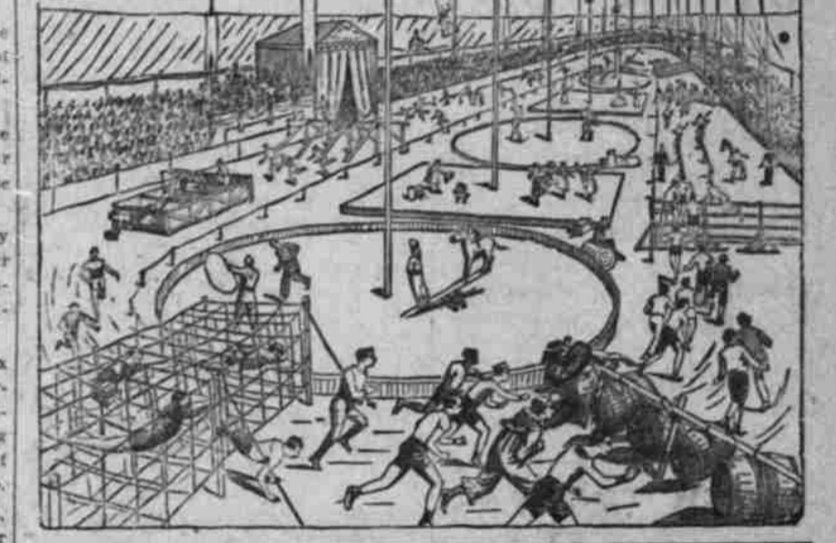
