

STRANGE FREAK OF A MILLIONAIRE

John W. Bookwalter Sells Out His Property Because of Hate.

GRUDGE AGAINST THE TOWN

Sails for Europe to Get Away From the Place Where He Married, Lived a Quarter of a Century and Made His Riches.

Springfield, O., August 9.—The leaving of John W. Bookwalter, capitalist and globe-trotter, to take passage for Europe last week, marked a turning point in an interesting story of wrongs imagined, of futile outbreaks of resentment on the part of the citizens and of his deep hatred for the place which by virtue of his heavy holdings and his semi-occasional returns to look after them, is called his home.
