

OHIO POPULISTS WILL NOT FUSE

Captured the State Convention and Regulated Fusion.

TURBULENT SCENES ENACTED

Jacob Coxey Nominated for Governor—Bombs Exploded in the Convention—Five Minute Speeches Only Allowed.

Columbus, O., August 11.—Fusion was repudiated today by the populists of Ohio in a manner so emphatic as to leave no chance for a controversy regarding the future policy of the party.

The populist state convention, by an overwhelming majority, refused to acknowledge the alliance made a year ago on the silver issue, and nominated a full state ticket headed by Jacob Coxey, of Commonweal, as the nominee for governor.

Turbulent scenes marked the opening of the convention. The anti-fusionists had swept everything before them, capturing the temporary and permanent organization and all the committees, and were on their mettle. Nor was the policy adopted by the fusionists calculated to temper the feeling aroused among the middle of the road delegates. The threat of the fusionists to explode a bomb in the convention was like flaunting a red flag before a bull, and when the convention assembled the delegates were ready for any surprise that might be sprung.

The report of the committee on rules and order of business brought out the promised sensation. The report provided that no speech should exceed five minutes, regardless of the subject discussed. Several delegates joined in the protest against this provision, claiming that it was contrary to the fundamental principles of the people's party and an amendment was reported to strike out of the report the obnoxious section. Finally Peter White, of Cleveland, secured recognition from Chairman Zetta, and mounting a chair proceeded to denounce the committee making the report, and asserted that the convention had been bought out by Mark Hanna. He claimed he had proof that delegates had been bribed by the republicans.

TREMENDOUS WHEAT CROP. Reports From State of Washington Are Beyond Belief.

Spokane, August 11.—The Spokeman-Review has crop reports from special correspondents in Spokane, Walla Walla, Adams, Whitman, Lincoln, Kittitas, Yakima, Douglas, and Latah and Nez Perce counties, Idaho. These cover the principal grain producing sections of Eastern Washington and northern Idaho. Reports are still to come from Astoria, Douglas and Okanogan counties. In some cases the returns are incredible. The total as compiled from these reports is beyond belief. The estimated wheat yield alone, to say nothing of oats and barley, as given by these reports, is 11,600,000 bushels.
