

AMERICA MUST FEED THE WORLD

STUPENDOUS SHORTAGE IN FOREIGN WHEAT, RYE AND POTATOES.

A Total of One Billion Six Hundred and Twenty-Five Million Bushels Less than the Normal Yield in Europe.

Springfield, Mass., August 25.—An inquiry into European crop conditions, conducted by the Orange-Judd syndicate of agricultural papers, including the American Agriculturist, of New York, the Orange-Judd Farmer, of Chicago, and the New England Homestead, of Springfield, Mass., indicates that the food crop situation abroad is very grave. Estimates of Europe's (including England) needs of wheat imports range all the way from 200,000,000 to 400,000,000 bushels.
