The members of the common council have not yet started for Columbus, Ohio, to attend the national meeting of mayors and councilmen. It transpires that the ordinance appropriating travelling expenses for the mayor and councilmen of Astoria only passed the second reading. Possibly by the time the act becomes a law the convention will have met and adjourned and \$500 will have been saved to the taxpayers of Astoria.
