PEARY PREPARING FOR HIS JOURNEY

UNLIMITED FUNDS AT HIS BACK AND FIVE YEARS' SUPPLIES.

He Will Make a Determined Effort in a Search for the North Pole.

New York, October 1.—When the whaling steamer Hope arrived at her dock in Brooklyn, Lieutenant Peary and a party of friends were on hand to meet her.

In an interview, Lieutenant Peary said: "I took observations to ascertain just how much further north it would be possible to navigate, and I also visited the settlement of Esquimaux known as Arctic Highlanders, who live some 20 miles north of Meville bay.

"I want to say that I never asserted that I would find the north pole or die in the attempt; but I shall make a determined effort to find it, and I shall have practically unlimited funds at my command and five years' time.

"I shall sail to the most northern limit possible and then make a landing on sledges, carrying all the necessary outfit for a permanent camp to the most northern limit. It is known that land exists as far north as latitude 83. How much further it extends, I shall have to determine, and when I reach that point I shall make permanent camps and make them my base of supplies.
