Was born in Indiana in 1822, and was married to Mr. A. C. Wirt in 1840.

Mr. and Mrs. Wirt lived in Illinois until 1843. Their first child, Andrew, was born in October, 1842.

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO IMPROVE SIX AND SEVEN STREETS AND NIAGARA AVENUE FROM GRAND AVENUE TO BAY AVENUE.

Notice is hereby given that the Common Council of the City of Astoria, Oregon, did on the 19th day of October, 1897, by resolution, order and direct the Auditor and Police Judge of said city to publish in the Daily Astorian of Astoria, for ten days, notice to said Common Council's intention to make the following improvement, to-wit:

That 6th street, from Grand Avenue into Niagara Avenue, thence Niagara Avenue from a connection with proposed improvement of 8th street, to and into 7th street, thence 7th street from a connection with the proposed improvement of Niagara Avenue, to north side of Bay Avenue, be improved by grading said portions of said streets and avenues for the space of twelve and one-half feet on each side of the center line thereof to the established grade thereof; and by planing the same with plank three inches by twelve inches for the space of sixteen feet wide on the crossings and on the other portions of the improvement twelve feet wide, six feet wide on each side of the center line; also by constructing a sidewalk on one side of said graded portion, four feet wide.

Said planing and lumber to be new, sound and of the best quality.

Said improvement to be made in accordance with the general ordinances governing improvements of streets, and with the special ordinances and specifications prepared for this improvement by the city surveyor.

This improvement shall be known and designated as Young's Bay Improvement No. 1. The district of lands and premises to be benefited, and which will be benefited by the above improvement, and upon which special assessment shall be levied to defray the cost and expense of said improvement, is as follows:

Now, therefore, unless a remonstrance signed by the residents of the city of Astoria owning more than one-half of the property in the above described district shall be filed with the undersigned by the time of the next regular meeting of the common council of said city (viz: Nov. 5, 1897), after said ten days' publication of this notice, the said common council will proceed to make said improvement; but in case such a remonstrance shall be so filed, then said improvement cannot be authorized by the two-thirds vote of all the members of the said council.
