The British ship Dehtreyer, from Antwerp, with a general cargo, arrived in late yesterday evening.

The pilot schooner Jessie is now in service outside. The San Jose is tied up at the O. R. & N. dock.

The schooner Edward Purke, Captain Jensen, 20000 feet lumber, cleared from the custom house yesterday.

A large British man-of-war, of the type of the Charleston, passed up the coast in the Mashona came in yesterday.

The British bark Duzen, 1067 tons, Captain Nicol, from Valparaiso in ballast, arrived in yesterday and anchored in the stream.
