SEATTLE WAY.

Flures compiled for railway use show a surprising rash of travel between Puget Sound and ports for Klondike. Between July 17 and September 11—eight weeks—1,515 persons took passage for St. Michaels, and 7,235 went to Fort Wrangel, Juneau, Skagway and Taku. During this period 12,665 tons of freight were shipped to St. Michaels, and about 24,000 tons to the other ports, including British Columbia ports. Moreover 3,560 horses and mules were shipped north, 1,161 head of beef, and over 2,600 dogs.—Railway Age.
