Recently the Columbia Iron works placed on exhibition a propellor known as the "Harrison wheel." It is the invention of Mr. Sam Harrison, who claims more than one virtue for it. It is a secuonal wheel, and, unlike other wheels of a simflar idea, needs but little machine work A collar with a V shape groove is shrunk onto the propellor shaft near the bearing. Another collar, an exact counterpart, is loose upon the shaft near the end. Between the two collars are the blades and are made secure by screwing up a nut at the end of the shaft. Aside from the amplicity of the pattern, making it possible to uqlekly repair a broken blade, the huge bulk of the bub found in all
