Mr. Gookin would have the gold standand established by a declaration that all government obligations shall be payable in gold, and defining silver dollars as representative money only.

He thinks that if the government notes are not retired the logal tender quality should be taken from them. In this opinion he has the support of many wise statesmen. When the proposition to issue these notes was raised in 1862 many of our leading men took the ground that to make them legal tender added nothing to their value as a circulating medium, but endowed them with a quality that in the end would result in nothing but mischief. And this has proven true. We do not look upon this question as particularly important now, for we hope to see them all withdrawn from circulation. In fact we can have no true monetary reform until the government notes are put at least

The real evil of the legal tender notes Mr. Gookin points out when he says that for thirty-five years they have been the monetary standard of the country, and everything that has affected the treasury has affected business.
