THE MANILA EXPEDITION. San Francisco, May 14.—It is expected that within ten days 12,000 volunteers will be embarked at the Presidio. General Merrim has advised those in charge here that arrangements must be made at once for the embarkation of the men.

THE OREGON REGIMENT. Portland, May 14.—Ten companies of the Oregon volunteers are now ready to join service in the United States army, having been mustered in by the United States recruiting officer. The remaining two
