of the fourth expedition and will probably remain here until all the troops are embarked. It is hoped to accomplish this on or before July 1.

WORD FROM GOMEZ

Two Cuban Officers Have Arrived in New York.

New York, June 18.—Rafael Curto of the Cuban army has arrived at the headquarters of the Cuban junta here with dispatches from Havana. He was accompanied by a lieutenant of the "Army of Liberation." Captain Curto and his companion left Gomez in Las Yayas. The general then had with him a body guard of only sixty men—a cavalry escort.

There was but little food in the region where Gomez was making his headquarters, so he did not issue any large number of men here. They had been supplied with a large quantity and directed their movements from headquarters. He has all arrangements made for the concentration of the troops when the proper time comes, but keeps them scattered and employed in a variety of ways in the mountains, so that they may not be found.

After leaving Gomez the envoys made their way to the sea coast, living on sweet potatoes and fruit which they found along the way. For two days they were without food. Finally they reached the coast between Matanzas and Cardenas and were taken by a fishing boat to a small bay until a vessel of the blockade had been reported when they put off in row boats and were picked up six miles off the coast. The tug which picked them up was the *General*, Captain Purcell. The *Osceola* is one of the auxiliary fleet. They were nearly naked and nearly famished when they were taken on board the *Osceola*, but the officers of the vessel, and the crew, with their food and clothing and carried them to Key West. From there they came to this city with their associates.

It is understood a definite plan for the cooperation of the troops under Gomez with the United States troops when the time for cooperation has been arranged between the general and the war department at Washington. Meanwhile Gomez will keep the forces scattered.

Captain Curto says that from information received from Gomez's spies it is known that in all the garrisoned towns held by the Spaniards sickness is making great ravages among the troops. The hospitals in Havana are so overcrowded with sick that proper medical attention cannot be given. The coal supply is nearly exhausted and has been taken in charge by Hagan, who has his officers supervise consumption. The electric light company recently received an order to shut off their dynamo at midnight so that coal might be husbanded. After the hour at which the light works shut down, Havana is in darkness.

OREGON'S POSTED LESSON.

The republican state ticket has been elected in Oregon by over 1000 majority, with 1000 the republican congressmen and an overwhelming republican majority in both branches of the legislature. This victory was won over a perfect fusion of democrats, populists and free silver Republicans. The money issue was squarely accepted by the republican party for declaring the following square-headed sound money plank in the platform:

We are in favor of the maintenance of the present gold standard.
We are unqualifiedly opposed to the free exchange of silver and to all other schemes looking to the devaluation of the currency and the repudiation of debt.
We consider it the duty of the government to free silver as calculated to preserve the prosperity of the country.

Oregon has long been considered by the free silverers, and the republicans have been victorious time and again by the cheap money fever that the demagogues had inspired among the farmers of that state. So strong was the cheap money repudiation sentiment that the republicans have not, for the past, had the courage to make an honest stand for honest money, but this year they resolved to do so, and presented in the foregoing plank of their platform a most sensible and positive expression in favor of a sound financial system.

There is hardly a single state in the union that would not vote for sound money if the issue could be thus fairly presented to the people. The American people are not deluded; they mean that a dollar should be worth a dollar and that if they own a dollar they should pay it in a dollar that is worth a dollar. They appreciate the credit and dignity of the great republic of the world and would not consent to degrading its currency to the standard of the barbarian.

Oregon has given a most pointed lesson to guide honest people in every state in the support of honest money, and the effect of this overwhelming majority in the far western state that has long been disturbed by cheap money demagogues, must be most salutary throughout the entire western states.

The time is not far distant when the men who have advocated free silver, cheap money and repudiation, will be hoisted up on a pole and their heads used as a spectacle, which would have made the circulating medium of this country and worth a cent on a dollar. Honest money means honest people, and honest people must mean the overthrow of blabbering demagogues who insist upon making false claims to cheat the people and dishonor the republic.

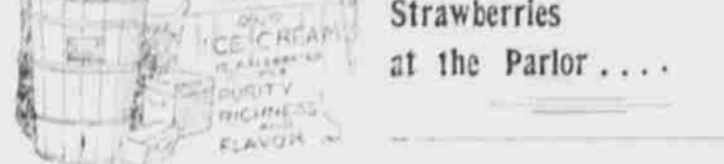
